Miss Molineaux supports with behaviours and Miss Tomlinson supports with attendance. We offer an open-door policy so that we are available when you need us and we create a safe space for parents to speak to us.

Our Graduated Approach to SEND

Many children across Weddington take part in a variety of interventions to help meet their individual needs. For some children this will be a short catch up intervention or a little additional emotional—support, others receive a more intensive program of support. Wherever possible, our interventions take place at times that mean children do not miss out on the curriculum and they are delivered in a fun, supportive and positive manner. We always welcome your feedback regarding SEND provision so please do not hesitate to let me know your views.

The additional support any child receives is recorded on an individual monitoring form. Some children may go on to require a Personalised Learning Plan (PLP). For certain children, we may ask outside agencies to become involved to help support a child's needs or when more complex needs exist. Where a child has significant and / or complex needs, an Educational Health Care Pan (EHCP) may be required. To enable closer monitoring your child may be added to the school SEN record.

Our Vision:

For schools to be places where everyone feels valued, included, safe, supported and welcome. We will work together to enable all our children and young people in Warwickshire to lead a fulfilling life and be part of their community.

Welcome and Care

We will:

- Understand that every child is an individual
- Recognise the value of inclusion
- Make time to get to know you and what is Important to you and your family
- Establish and build on positive relationships
- Make time to respond to your needs
- Work closely with all relevant people to ensure successful transitions
- Ensure children and young people's voices are at the heart of all we do



The Charter:

This charter sets out what all children and young people and their families should expect from schools in Warwickshire, in line with the SEND Code of Practice.

Communicate

- Listen calmly and respectfully, with patience, ensuring you feel heard and understood.
- Establish how to provide and seek information in a way you can access and understand
- Recognise all behaviour is a form of communication
- Explain what can be done and any limitations
- Communicate in a way that means you can participate in planning and decision making
- Provide clear guidance on who to contact and respond promptly
- Make you comfortable by using positive and helpful language
- Create and maintain communication friendly environments



Developing and nurturing each of these commitments to build

TRUST

Value and Include

- Remember inclusion is everyone's responsibility
- Be proactive in providing reasonable adjustments
- Ensure our SENCo is able to support families and staff
- Inform and support you of any planned changes as soon as possible
- Ensure that children and young people with SEND are valued and included in pupil voice activities
- Identify needs early and assess, plan, do, review with support from appropriate agencies
- Ensure our children and young people have a trusted person who checks in with them at least weekly
- Have a 'can do' attitude and build on everyone's strengths
- Recognise and meet the training needs of our staff

We will:


- Give you opportunities to share your views
