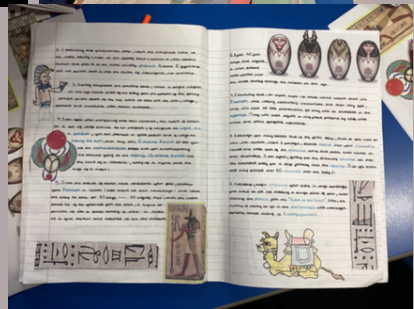
KS1 VALUES ASSEMBLY

Eye Tests for Children – Has your child's eyesight been checked recently?

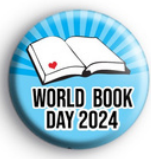


Free NHS sight tests are also available at opticians for children under 16 and for young people under 19 in full-time education.

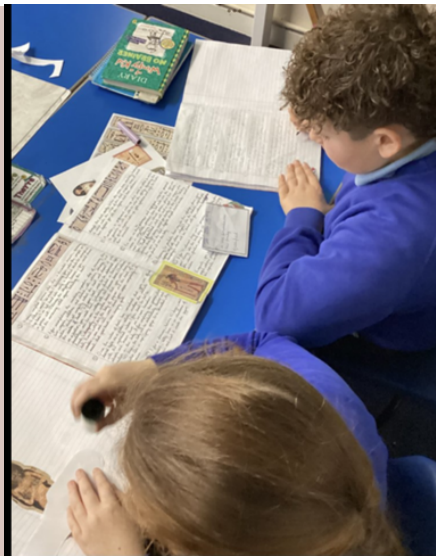
Your child's eyes are examined soon after they start school. This is called **vision screening** and it checks for reduced vision in one or both eyes. The aim is to detect any problems early so that treatment can be given if needed. Children should be having regular eye tests as they grow up approximately every 2 years.

In older children, signs of a possible eye problem can include:

- the eyes not pointing in the same [direction](#)
- complaining of headaches or eye strain
- problems reading – for example, they may need to hold books close to their face and they may lose their place [regularly](#)
- problems with hand-eye co-ordination – for example, they may struggle to play ball [games](#)
- being unusually clumsy
- regularly rubbing their eyes
- sitting too close to the TV
