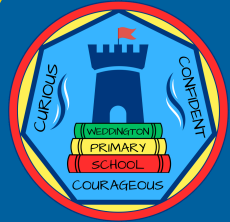

KS1 Values Assembly

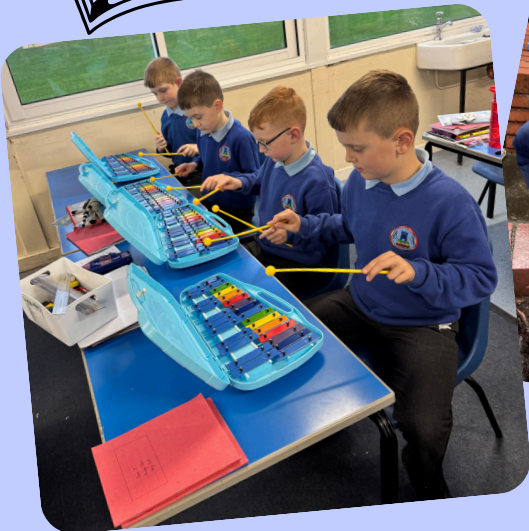
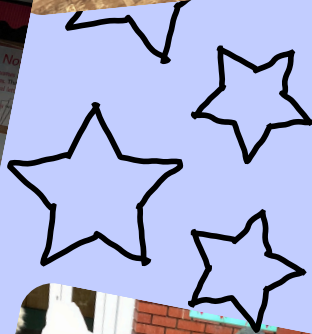
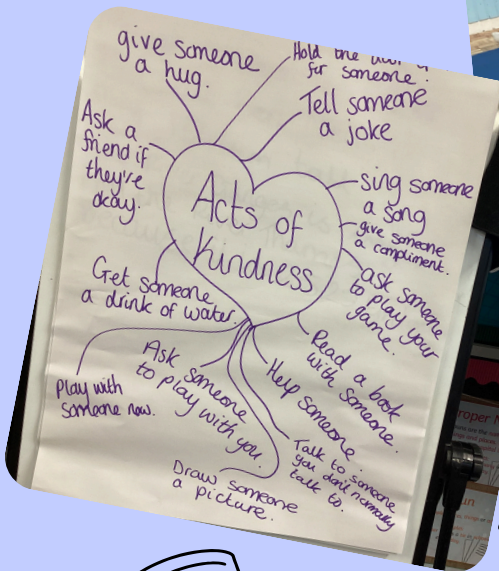
We loved celebrating our KS1 Values Assembly winners this week – such a joyful moment seeing our youngest children shine!

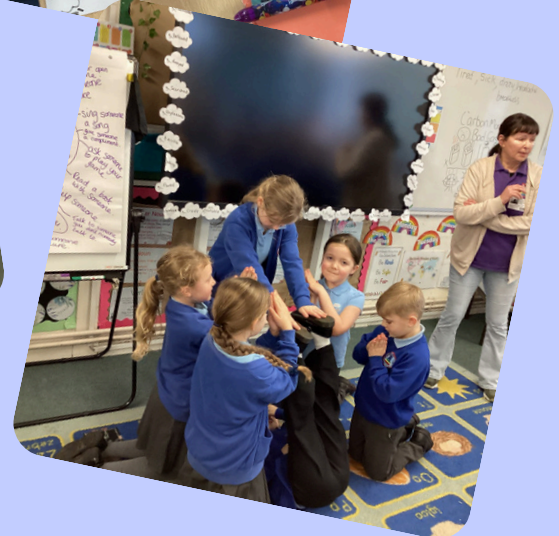
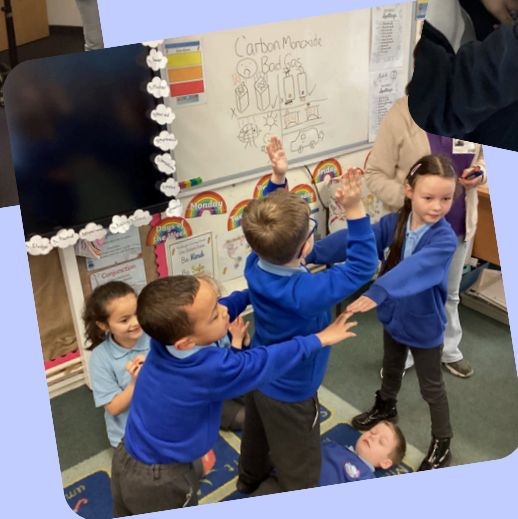
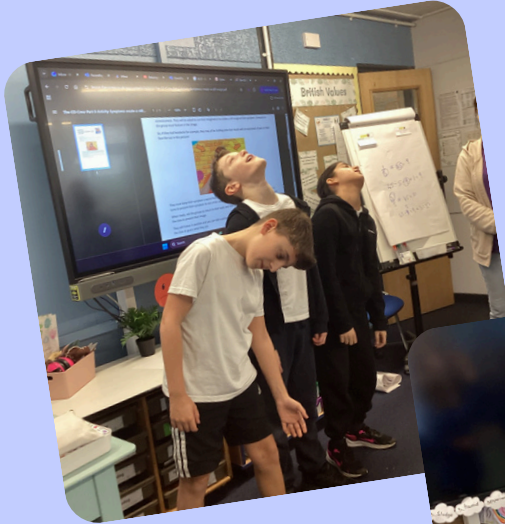

Our Learning This Week





This week, Years 2 and 5 were visited by a member of the 'CO Crew'. They are on a mission to help children protect themselves and the homes they live in from carbon monoxide poisoning.

During the session, we learnt how to stay safe, spot the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning and what signs we should be looking for. We learnt some very important facts about the poisonous gas carbon monoxide. If you breath it in, it can make you very ill. You can't see, hear, smell, taste or touch it, which is why it's known as the 'silent killer'. We were made aware of the appliances that help us with cooking and heating our homes that could be a possible danger. Some of the symptoms caused by carbon monoxide poisoning are: headaches, dizziness, breathlessness, nausea, collapse and loss of consciousness.

If we suspect that there is a carbon monoxide leak, we should tell an adult and they should call the National Gas Emergency number on 0800 111 999.

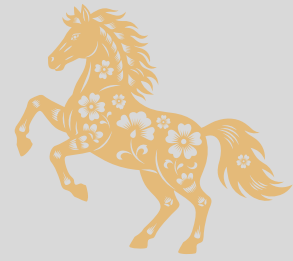

Between Tuesday 17th February and Tuesday 3rd March people all over the world, as well as those in our local community, will be celebrating Chinese New Year. Chinese New Year is a Lunar New Year festival and is one of many celebrated in Asia and the dates are determined by moon cycles. The fifteen-day celebration begins with a new moon and ends on the full moon. To celebrate people eat delicious food, spend time with their families and have firework displays.

The last event of the long celebration is a Lantern Festival. Many people hang glowing lanterns in temples or carry them during a night time parade. People also dress as an enormous dragon and dance through the streets to mark the occasion.

Parking Safely Around School

Never park across driveways, on corners, or where access is blocked

Avoid stopping where children's view of the road is reduced

Walk to school where possible – it's safer and healthier

If driving, park a little further away and walk the last part

Show respect to our neighbours and local community

We're working closely with the police, and fines have already been issued for dangerous parking. Where needed, unsafe parking may also be reported to support everyone's safety.

Thank you to the many families who already park responsibly – your support really does make a difference. Together, we can keep our school environment safe, calm and respectful for all.

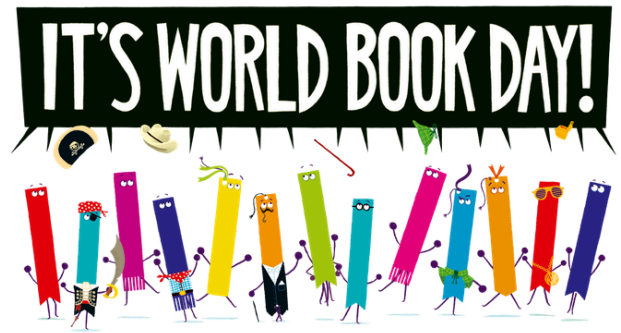
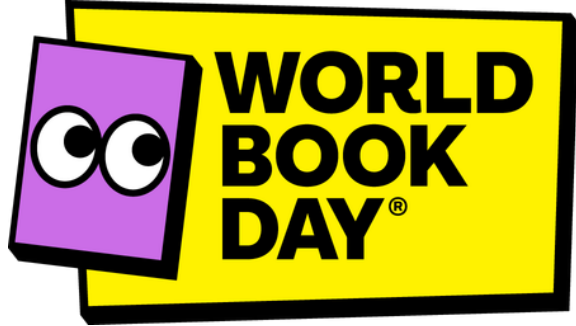

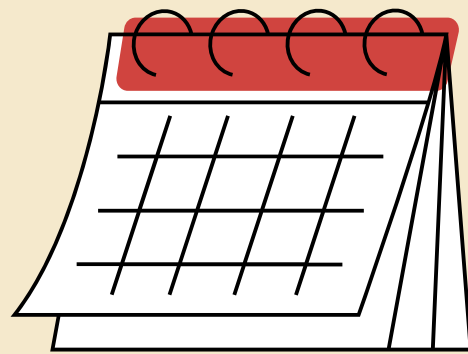
