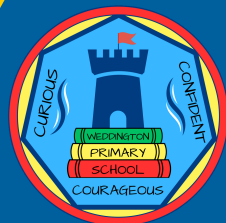

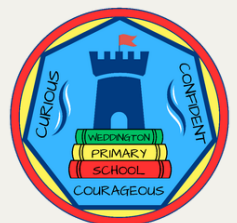

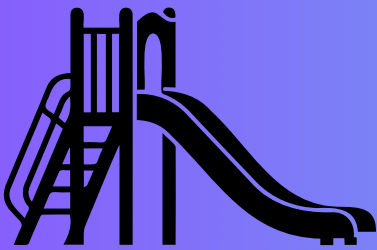

Please pass on our thanks to Luca and Freddie. They should be very proud of the kindness they showed that day.

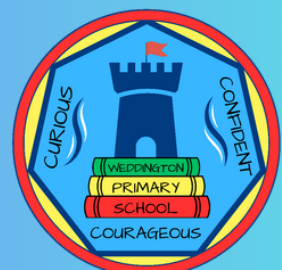

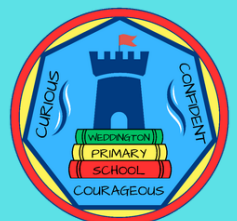
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Water Safety Assembly

The Martyrdom of Guru Arjan Dev

For many Sikh families, the 16th June this year is a very special day. It is a day where they remember the fifth Sikh Guru, who endured great suffering and lost his life because his religious movement was growing very powerful in the early 17th century, and he refused to change his beliefs to please the Mughal Emperor Jahangir. It is not a day of mourning but instead a day of reflection that focuses on understanding the Guru's courage and turning a painful tragedy into acts of kindness and community service for many of those who follow Sikhism.

Sikh children bring the occasion to life through several meaningful traditions:

- **Serving Chabeel:** During the hot summer months, children and adults serve Chabeel—a sweet, cold, and refreshing drink. This teaches Sikh children to respond to negativity with positivity and sweetness, honouring the Guru's peaceful mindset.
- **Participating in Langar:** Children help serve langar, the free community meal provided at gurdwaras (Sikh places of worship). The Sikh community provide this meal for anybody in the community who may need food, even if they aren't Sikh. This shows the Sikh values of equality and selfless service.
- **Learning through Stories:** Children attend special classes or Katha at the local Gurdwara where they learn about the Guru's life. They hear stories about his bravery, his love for all people, and his role in compiling the Guru Granth Sahib (the Sikh holy book).
- **Katha and Kirtan:** Many families listen to or sing kirtan (hymns) together. This helps them to connect with the prayers of peace the Guru wrote.
- **Remembering with Love:** Lights and candles are often lit in the evening to honour Guru Arjan Dev's legacy.



Did you know?...

- ❖ There are approximately 30 million Sikhs in the world, with around 400,000 living in the UK.
- ❖ Sikhism was founded in India about 500 years ago.
- ❖ Sikhs believe there is only one God, that everybody is equal and that people should all help one another.
- ❖ There have been 10 gurus altogether, but the tenth and final guru made the Guru Granth Sahib (their holy book), which serves as the final and eternal guru.
- ❖ Baptised Sikhs show their commitment to their faith by wearing 5 special items that all begin with the letter K.

Parking Around School

Last week, our School Council helped us look carefully at parking around school, particularly near the junction of Winchester Avenue and Romsey Avenue. The Highway Code states that drivers should not stop or park opposite or within 10 metres of a junction, unless in an authorised parking space. This is because it blocks visibility and makes it much harder for children, families and drivers to see safely.

As you can see from the photographs, the children stood 10 metres from the junction to show just how much space should be kept clear. This area becomes extremely busy, especially in the mornings, and cars parking or turning around there creates a real safety concern.

Please help us keep everyone safe by parking a short distance away and walking to school where possible. Giving yourself a few extra minutes in the morning really does make a difference. We completely understand that mornings are busy, but the safety of our children and families has to come first. Thank you for your continued support.

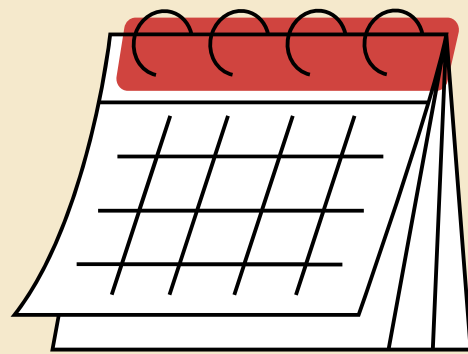
